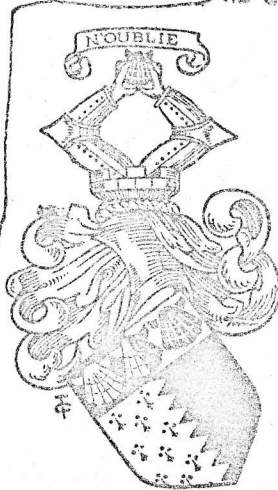


GRAHAM OF EDMOND CASTLE he d. 19 Ma

*Lineage*—THOMAS GRAHAM, of Edmond Castle, descended from a branch of the GRAHAMS of Esk (*see BURKE'S Peerage, GRAHAM of Esk, Bt.*), m. Mary Nicholson, and left (with an elder son, William, b. 1716; d. 1724) an only surviving son, THOMAS GRAHAM, of Edmond Castle, Cumberland, J.P., b. 1718; m. 31 Jan. 1749, Margaret (d. 1816, *et. 91*), dau. of Thomas Coulthard, of Scotby, and had issue,

James (Sir), of Kirkstall, *cr.* a Baronet 3 Oct. 1808, Recorder of Appleby, M.P. for Cockermouth 1802-5, for Wigtown Burghs 1805-6, again for Cockermouth 1807-12, and for Carlisle 1812-25, b. 13 Nov. 1753; m. 17 June, 1781, Anne (d. 28 Aug. 1821), only dau. of Rev. Thomas Moore, of Kirkstall, Yorks. and d. 21 March, 1825, having had with two daus (Anne, m. 23 June, 1812, Lieut.-Gen. Sir Adolphus-John Dalrymple, 1st and last Bt., and *d.s.p.* 10 May, 1858; and Margaret), an only son,

(3) Cyril Clerke (Sir), 5th and last Bt., C.M.G., F.R.G.S., F.R.A.S., a distinguished linguist and traveller, Lieut.-Gov. of the Island of Grenada, 1875-7, b. 6 Mar. 1834; m. 24 Oct. 1874, Louisa Frederica (d. 27 Jan. 1906), 2nd dau. of Rev. Lord Charles Amelius Hervey, D.D. (see BURKE'S Peerage, BRISTOL, M.), and d. 9 May, 1895, when the baronetcy became extinct, having had issue, two daus.,

1a. Violet Evelyn Cecilia (36, Sloane Gardens, S.W.), m. 29 May, 1900, Sir William Montagu Graham-Harrison, K.C.B. (1926), K.C., Barrister-at-Law, Fellow of All Souls Coll. Oxford, Vicar of St. John, Notting Hill, 1916-25, and Rural Dean of Kensington 1924-25, Canon of Rochester from 1925, Treasurer from 1932 (The Precinct, Rochester), and d. 12 Jan. 1921, leaving issue, five daus.
